Glacier Girl

I had the pleasure of joining two of my model airplane friends here in Florida to attend the annual Sun' n Fun Fly in at Lakeland Florida.

Sun' n Fun is like a baby sister to Oshkosh. Lots of impressive aircraft. The most interesting to me was a P-38 Lockheed Lightning called "Glacier Girl" that had been salvaged from beneath the ice in Greenland. She was part of a squadron of P-38s and B-17s all of which were forced down on the Greenland Ice cap during a 1942 ferry flight to Britain. They were eventually covered with 268 feet of snow and ice.

Some 50 years later they were finally found with special electronic equipment and a unique machine that melted a shaft to bring them up. Most of the aircraft were destroyed but the one P-38 was thought to be restorable. She was brought up through the shaft in pieces.



Anyway I saw this aircraft do about 10 high speed passes along the flight line at 400+ miles per hour. Those twin Allison engines sounded absolutely magnificent. The owner will only let one pilot fly this aircraft and what a job he does.

Glacier Girl only had 47 hours when she landed on the ice cap and since restoration has another 132 hours in her log. See web site the http://lostsquadron.com
